The Canadian Agricultural Partnership (CAP) is a five year, \$3 billion federalprovincial-territorial initiative that has replaced the Growing Forward 2 program. In Alberta, we will see \$406 million in programs and initiatives relating to the agriculture and agri-food industry.

Based on consultations leading up April 2018, CAP in Alberta will deliver programs under five themes: Environmental Sustainability and Climate Change, Products, Market Growth and Distribution, Science and Research, Risk Management, and Public Trust. In total, there will be 15 programs under CAP. then need to be approved by an AF Water Specialist. PCBFA can help you with completing your LTWMP and get you in contact with our local AF Water Specialist.

The Environmental Stewardship and Climate Change Producer Program is similar again to its Growing Forward 2 predecessor, the On-Farm Stewardship program. This program is meant to support sustainable production practices, while reducing producer impact on the environment. Eligible activities under this program include: off-site watering systems (off of natural water bodies, such as ponds or creeks), riparian fencing, manure

management, shelterbelts, and equipment such as sectional control for sprayers and grain bag rollers. Cost share under this program is up to 70% of eligible expenses to a maximum of \$100,000 over the term of the program.

The Environmental Stewardship and Climate Change program does require the applicant to have a completed Environmental Farm Plan (EFP) within the last 10 years. If you would like to complete an EFP, or would like to look into applying for funding through this program, please give us a call!
